Purpose: To provide a scholarship to one graduate student attending a U.S. university seeking a graduate degree in science or engineering.

Award Components: One \$2500 scholarship will be awarded.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Applicant must be a full time student accepted to or enrolled in an accredited program that awards graduate degrees.
2. Applicant must be a resident of the U.S.
3. Major area must be a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) related field.
4. Open to graduate students enrolled at a university in the United States.

Application Process

Applicant must submit the following items:

1. Completed application form
2. A brief (one page) explanation of career goals and biographical (background) information.
3. A 2,500 word essay on the student's research and its application to achieving interstellar missions, in .docx format (Word).

Deadline for the application is **May 15, 2020**.

Applications emailed after this date will not be considered.
