Purpose: To provide scholarships to two rising college students planning to attend a four-year college seeking their first undergraduate degree.

Award Components: Two \$2500 scholarships will be awarded.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Applicant must be a full-time student accepted to or enrolled in an accredited college or university that awards Bachelor of Science or Arts degrees.
2. Major must be in a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) related field.
3. Open to high school seniors and present undergraduates who are U.S. citizens and live in the United States and/or its territories. The scholarship may be used at any college or university in the United States.

Application Process

Applicant must submit the following items:

1. Completed application form
2. A brief (one page) explanation of career goals and biographical (background) information.
3. A 1,000 – 2,000-word essay on one of the subjects suggested below, in .docx format (Word).

Deadline for the application is **May 31, 2023**. Applications emailed after this date will not be considered.
